6. President's Report

- 6.1. Started the year with the Go-Forward meeting. Themes were building a stronger community presence, bigger volunteer base, swag, expand citizen science and grow our relationship with the Tsuut'ina
- 6.2. Another year of Covid
- 6.3. Paul Past-president, is moving away from responsibilities on the Board but will continue with another spring clean up
- 6.4. Maureen Executive Director. Great job
- 6.5. Education programs Spencer, the new coordinator. Doing a great job. We've had a normal year of interaction with schools. 4000+ people, 150 days of programs
- 6.6. Recognized the Naturalists for training the new Naturalists
- 6.7. Invasive Plant program back up and was a lot of hard work
- 6.8. Wildlife we lost 4 bears this year. People leaving food in the parks, the bears are becoming habituated. This is why we try to manage the bird feeders in the Weaselhead
- 6.9. High levels in the reservoir The City water management has to coordinate servicing the city and avoiding floods therefore, they keep the water at current high levels
- 6.10. The beaver pond dried up this year. We are going to monitor and figure out the cause
- 6.11. Impact Study this is the last year of data collection. There was counting, identifying and returning samples. A lot of serious work being done
- 6.12. Creek Watch Judi Vandenbrink took over Creek Watch from Matt Wallace. We had 12 volunteers collecting data

- 6.13. Nocturnal Preserve It's not official yet and there is lots of work to do yet
- 6.14. Events
 - 6.14.1. River Clean Up Again, thank you Paul. There was more garbage this year may be due to more users of the park as a result of Covid travel restrictions
 - 6.14.1.1. To the people who pick up garbage throughout the park every day, thank you
 - 6.14.2. The Casino Gary Haerle, Thank you. This was a two day event and we raised \$62,000. Thank you to all those volunteers. We hope to have another casino in the first quarter of 2024

7. Habitat Management Framework Plan (Jason Weiller)

- 7.1. Jason is one of the Parks ecologists with the City
- 7.2. The City has recently developed a 10 year management plan for the City parks
 - 7.2.1. Work will begin on the Weaselhead plan in early 2023
 - 7.2.2. Jason is looking forward to working with the Society as primary contributors
- 7.3. Collectively manage together. Public engagement on the plans scheduled for Q1 2023
- 7.4. On behalf of the City, thanks to the Society for all the work with Citizen Science and education
- 7.5. Someone asked if there was an "adopt a park" program? Jason responded and said something was in the works to re-boot the program
- 7.6. Yves wanted to recognize Susan Ryan for her dedicated work on the water levels

8. Financial report

- 8.1. Maureen Luchsinger presented the 2021/2022 report in the absence of Treasurer, Nicole Krawczyk
- 8.2. We've closed the financial year with sound financial results with lifting of covid restrictions and the resumption of educational programs
- 8.3. There is approximately \$143,000 \$77,000 in the general account and \$86,000 in the casino account. The casino is the largest fundraising activity
- 8.4. We are almost back to pre-pandemic levels
- 8.5. There was \$94,000 in expenses which are attributed to the impact study, educational resources and operating costs to run the society
- 8.6. The financials were audited
- 8.7. There is a conservative budget for next year and we anticipate some inflation
- 8.8. The proposed budget was reviewed and approved by the Board of Directors
- 8.9. Motion to accept the financial report by Gary Haerle, seconded by Matt Wallace. No objections. Motion carried
